Card Number: 1, Kite

I have a brown body and a forked tail. I like to live near humans and you can find me everywhere – in cities, towns and villages. I am a very strong flier. I can turn and twist in the air very easily. This helps me in finding food on traffic-congested roads and also in avoiding the tangles of all those overhead electrical wires! I often look for food in the garbage bins and also like to eat lizards and mice. I make my nest with twigs, wires, rags etc., on large trees or rooftops.

Can you guess my name?

Card Number: 2, Koel

I have shiny black feathers, with a greenish-yellow beak and red eyes. I usually stay alone or in pairs. I love trees and you will always find me in gardens and groves amongst large, leafy trees. I love to eat fruits, berries and also caterpillars and insects. I am usually quiet during the winter season but you will hear my "kuoo, kuoo" very frequently during the summers. I do not like to make nests so, I just lay my eggs in the nests of my friend – the crow..!

Card Number: 3, Seagull

I have grey and white feathers and a grayish-white head. I come to India in September and leave by April. Seacoasts are my favourite places although sometimes I also stay near rivers. I am a strong flier and I can also float on water! I like to eat fish and insects. For me, the easiest way to get food is to follow the fishing boats – I always manage to get some fish that way!

And, my name is...?

Card Number: 4, Sarus crane

I am a big, tall grey coloured bird with red legs and a red head and neck. I always live in pairs near farmlands and marches. I fly with slow rhythmical wing strokes, with my neck and legs outstretched. I love to eat grains, vegetable shoots, insects and reptiles. I choose my partner for life and together we build our nests with reeds, stems and straw, in paddy fields or marshes.

Card Number: 5, Owl

I have grey, brown and white feathers on my body and I have a large round head. I usually stay alone or in pairs. I like to stay near human beings and mostly live in deserted buildings or ruins. I like to eat rats, and so I am very helpful to the human beings! I do not like daytime so, I rest and sleep during the day and hunt for my food at night. I make my nest out of straw, twigs and rags, in tree hollows or holes in ruined walls. I use the same nest again and again!

And, my name is...?

Card Number: 6, Egret

I have white feathers and a yellow beak. I like to live in groups and ride on the backs of cows and buffalos. I mostly eat grasshoppers and other insects, but sometimes I eat frogs and lizards too. At night, I love to rest on my favourite tree with all my friends around me. I build my nests with twigs and branches on large leafy trees.

Can you guess who I am?

Card Number: 7, Parakeet

I am a green coloured bird with a rose-coloured collar around my neck and a short, hooked red beak. I love to stay with my friends and we talk with each other all the time. I can stay in different kinds of places, so you will find me in forests, farms, villages and cites. I can fly very fast and you will often find me whizzing through the trees! I love to eat grains and fruits. I lay my eggs in tree hollows or in small holes in building walls.

Can you guess who I am?

Card Number: 8. Pond heron

I have a brown body and shiny white wings. You will always find me around water bodies like – rivers, lakes, ponds, mangroves etc.. I can eat many types of insects as well as, frogs, fish and crabs. I wade into the water and catch my food with my strong beak. I like to build my nests in large leafy trees like mango and tamarind.

Who do you think I am?

Card Number: 9, Tailor bird

I am a small green bird with a brown-coloured head. I like to stay in wooded areas, gardens and shrubbery. I am very comfortable with human beings and do not mind hopping around their gardens and potted plants! I like to eat insects and flower nectar. I like to keep myself busy and so, you will always find me hopping or flying around! My nest is very special – I build it with a lot of care. I stitch leaves together to form a funnel and then I fill it with soft fibers, cotton wool etc. to form a cup, to lay my eggs in!

Who do you think I am?

Card Number: 10, Mynah

I am a brown-coloured bird with yellow legs and a yellow beak. I stay in pairs or in small groups. I like to stay near human beings and so, you will find me everywhere – in villages, towns and big cities. I eat many different things like – fruits, insects, kitchen scraps etc.. I love to speak and I can make different kinds of calls! My nest is made up of twigs, roots and paper and you will often find it in a hole in a tree, wall or ceiling.

Card Number: 11, Bulbul

I am a brown-coloured bird with a pointy black head and a red mark below my tail. I usually stay in pairs or small groups. You will find me mostly in gardens and wooded areas. I like to eat insects, fruits and berries, peas and flower nectar. I am usually very cheerful and I also have a nice voice. So, human beings are always very happy to see me in their gardens! I make my nests with twigs, roots and cobwebs, in bushes or trees.

Can you guess my name?

Card Number: 12, Swift

I am a small black bird with a white throat, a short tail and long narrow wings. I always stay in groups and love to stay around human beings. You will find me around old buildings and houses. I mostly eat insects, and since I can fly very, very fast – I catch them as I am flying in the air! In the evenings, just before it is time to rest – I and my friends play with each other – we fly high-up in the sky together - twittering and screaming away loudly! I make my nests on walls and ceilings. My nest looks like a cup and is made up of feathers and straw which I glue together with my saliva!

Card Number: 13, Crow

I have black wings and feathers and a grey neck. I love to stay with human beings. In fact, you could say that I am the most familiar bird in Indian cities, towns and villages. I am very smart and courageous, that is why I can survive so successfully in so many places! I can eat almost anything – rats, kitchen scraps, fruits, eggs, grain...and much more! At night, I and my friends come together to rest on our favourite trees. I make my nest high-up in the trees with twigs, coir, wire etc.. Often I and my friends make our nests on the same tree!

Who do you think I am?

Card Number: 14, Piegon

I have grey feathers on my body and some small, shiny green and purple feathers on my neck. I live in groups and love to stay near human beings. I eat a variety of grains and nuts. Some of my favourite places are grain warehouses, old buildings and rocky cliffs. When I speak, I make this sound "gootr-goo, gootr-goo"..! I like to make my nests with twigs and sticks on ledges and rooftops of buildings.

Card Number: 15, Great Indian bustard

I have brown and white feathers and a black crest on my head. I like to live in small groups on open grass and scrub plains. I eat grains, shoots, insects, lizards etc.. I am a very heavy bird so, I have to use all my strength to take-off from the ground when I want to fly. Once I am in the air however, I can fly easily using my strong, broad wings. My nests are like shallow depressions and I like to make them at the base of thick bushes. Over time, human beings have relentlessly hunted me and my friends. Now, only a few of us remain. The human beings have now made some laws against hunting us anymore. Thank God!

Can you guess who I am?

Card Number: 16, Cormorant

I am glistening black in colour with a long, stiff tail and a hooked beak. I eat only fish and so, I stay near water-bodies like rivers, lakes, creeks etc.. I am an expert diver and I can also swim under the water. When I want to catch fish – I dive after them, chase them under the water and capture them in my strong beak. When my stomach is full, I like to sit on a rock and dry myself by stretching out my wings. I make my nests with twigs and branches on leafy trees.

Card Number: 17, Peacock

I live in deciduous forests usually near rivers or streams. Sometimes, I stay around towns and villages also. I love to eat grains, insects, snakes, lizards etc.. I like to stay in small groups and am very shy. I mostly walk on my legs but sometimes I fly specially, when somebody disturbs me suddenly! At night, I like to rest in large trees. I make my nest on the ground amongst dense bushes. I make a small hollow and line it with sticks and leaves. And, here is the most important clue – I am blue in colour with a long, beautiful tail and a beautiful crest on my head!

What is my name?

Card Number: 18, Crow pheasant

I am a glossy black-coloured bird with brown wings and a long, broad tail. I mostly stay alone or with one of my friends. You will find me around forests, grasslands and shrubbery. I am very comfortable with human beings so you will find me in gardens and bushes around houses, as well. I love to eat insects, lizards and mice. I look for my food by walking on the ground or hopping on tree branches. I usually make my nests on thorny bushes with twigs and leaves.

Card Number: 19, Magpie robin

I am a smart-looking black and white bird who mostly stays alone or in pairs. I live to live near shrubbery and gardens. Since I do not mind human beings, you can see me very easily in cities, towns and villages. I usually feed on insects and flower nectar. I like to sing and I often have a favourite place, like a tree-top or post, where I like to sit and sing in the mornings! I am also a very good mimic of other birds' calls! My nests are made of grass, roots and hair. You will mostly find them in a hole in an old wall, tree-trunk or branch.

Who am I?

Card Number: 20, Sun bird

I am a small bird shiny purple in colour with a slender curved beak. I love to live in gardens, orchards, farms and even forests. I eat insects and spiders, but mostly, I drink flower nectar. My curved beak and tubular tongue help me in sucking nectar. While I receive my food from the flowers, in return, I help them in 'pollination' or in spreading their seeds to different places! You will find my nests hanging from the tip of a branch of a bush or creeper. They look like pouches made of grass, cobwebs and pieces of bark.

Card Number: 21, Lapwing

I have brown and white feathers with a black head and neck. I can live in different kinds of places - farms, open fields, dry beds of rivers, ponds etc.. I love to eat insects and mollusks. I am always alert and ready to raise an alarm if I see anyone coming! When I speak it sounds like I am saying "Did-he-do-it?", "Did-he-do-it?"...! I lay my eggs on open ground, sometimes with a ring of pebbles around it. The colour of my eggs matches that of the ground so well...that it is almost impossible to find them!

And my name is...?

Card Number: 22, Hornbill

I have grey feathers, an enormous black and white beak and a long tail. I also have a casque on top of my beak. I like to live in large trees and so, you will often find me in banyan and peepul grooves near villages and towns. I love eating fruits but at times I also eat insects, lizards and mice. I have really big wings hence, when I fly from one tree to another I make a lot of noise! I make my nests in tree hollows. When it is time to lay the eggs the Mama-bird goes inside the hollow. The Papa-bird closes the mouth of the hollow with his droppings, leaving only a small slit, through which he feeds Mama-bird. Once the chicks hatch Papa-bird makes the mouth of the hollow wider and the Mama-bird comes out of the nest!

Card Number: 23, Woodpecker

I have lovely golden feathers on my back and black and white ones on my breast. I also have a red crest on my head and a very strong beak. I love staying in forests, groves and orchards and I especially like coconut and mango trees. My favourite food is insects and I look for them on the tree trunks by tapping and chiseling away the bark on the tree trunks. I also eat black ants, fruits and flower nectar. I can walk up the tree trunks in a straight line or in spirals. I can also slide down tree trunks as if in 'reverse gear'! I make my nests my creating hollows in stems or branches of trees.

Who am I?

Card Number: 24, Duck

I have brown a body and bright orange-red legs. I like to live in pairs or in small groups. You will always find me in rivers and lakes. I like to eat leaves and roots of water plants. When I look for food I tip my body into the water. This makes me look a little funny because you can only see my tail sticking out of the water at this time. But then, this way I get to eat really fresh and juicy leaves so, I do not mind! I make my nests with grass and weeds along the marshy banks of rivers and lakes.

Who do you think I am?

Card Number: 25, Fantail

I am a brown bird with a lovely tail that looks like a fan! I like to stay in gardens and shrubbery. I stay in cities and towns also, but only where there are a lot of trees and shrubs. I like to eat a variety of insects and I look for them all the time, either on the ground or, in the air. I have a lovely voice and can sing many beautiful notes. I can also make a neat little nest by using grass, fibers and cobwebs.

Can you guess who I am?

Card Number: 26, Hoopoe

I am a brown-coloured bird with lovely black and white zebra-like markings on my wings, back and tail. I also have a beautiful fanshaped crest on my head. I love to stay in lawns and gardens, in and around villages and towns. I love to eat insects and hence, I am a great help to the farmer! I look for my food by walking on the ground and poking the soil with my beak. When I speak, it sounds like this – "Hoo-po, hoo-po-po"..! You will find my nests in tree hollows and holes in the walls or ceilings of houses. I make my nest with straw and rags. Although it is a strong nest, I find it difficult to keep it clean and so it often has a bad smell!

Can you guess who I am?

Card Number: 27, Flamingo

I have long legs and a really long neck as well. I have white and pink feathers, brilliant scarlet wings and a curved, pink beak. I live to live near shallow rivers, lagoons and salt pans. I love to eat worms, insect larvae and seeds of water plants. I always stay with my friends and we love to talk with each other. We also like to fly alongside each other and we often fly in V-formations or single files. I and my friends also make our nests next to each others. We make our nests on the ground. They are about 6 inches tall and made out of mud.

Who do you think I am?

Card Number: 28, Sparrow

I am a small brown and white bird who loves to live near human beings. I can live in many different places likes – hills, plains and forest hamlets etc.. I love to different kinds of food like - grain, insects, fruits, flower nectar and kitchen scraps. In the evening, I and my friends come together to talk with each other and rest on our favourite trees. I make my nests out of straw and feathers using a hole in a ceiling, wall or any other safe place.

Card Number: 29, Bee eater

I am a small green bird with a long, slender beak. I usually stay in pairs or small groups. I love to stay near farms, forests, gardens etc., and you can often see me sitting on electrical wires and fences. I like to eat insects, especially bees – and the best part is that I am able to catch them as I am flying in the air! In the evening, I and my friends play with each other – we fly around and make a lot of noise. Finally, when we are tired we rest on our favourite leafy tree for the night! I make my nests by digging into the ground. My nest has a narrow tunnel leading into a wide chamber where I lay my eggs!






